Message from Rev Katharine Bland

Hello Friends,

I don't know if you have a morning routine, my preference is for a cup of tea and to read the news. During my daily scan of news updates this week I read this: "Sales of luxury chocolate and subscription wine rose during lockdown as Brits turned to comfort buying." What have you missed during lockdown? In various conversations people have said that they could get but without certain things but what they missed most was human contact.

During our isolation we have been unable to meet our loved ones, thankfully this is now easing -but with caution. Due to the wonders of technology we have seen and spoken with each other, however, the general response is 'but it's not the same.' We cannot kiss or hug our loved ones and many of us are struggling with that - understandably. I appreciate that not all of us are fully paid up members of the 'huggy' brigade, for some of us a handshake is sufficient and there is absolutely nothing wrong with that, but the need for human contact is very much in our DNA we might say.

This has caused me to reflect on the tactile nature of Jesus. He used His hands to heal, to comfort and to bless. He also touched lepers and made them clean, and He also used his hands to wash his disciples' dirty feet too!

As we prepare to return to church we need to heed carefully to the guidelines, especially those regarding what and who we touch or come into contact with.
