

Message from Rev Katharine Bland

Hello Friends,

Daily Bible reading notes are popular with a lot of people, and you can get them in book form or online. I don't know if that is something that you use, regularly, occasionally or never. I must admit, I do like to use something, particularly for my morning devotions, probably because I'm not a morning person, so a little inspiration is always appreciated until several cups of tea have had chance to wake me up! I like a variety too, never sticking to the same resource for too long. Often, I am unable to resist a sneaky peep, and have been known to read on and do a whole week's worth of daily readings in one go. Anyway, the point to this is, this morning I read ahead to Sunday's reading, aware that, both Glazebury and Culcheth Methodist Churches will be opening their doors for Sunday morning worship. I hasten to add that this information is correct only at the time of typing, and an announcement regarding restrictions within Warrington Borough could change these arrangements at very short notice.

So, assuming that you are reading this on Sunday 20th September, and our church building is open for worship...reflect for a moment on all the guidelines and restrictions that are in place to keep us safe. The main restriction is, of course, that we will all be wearing masks, talking with one another, and therefore hearing one another, at a socially safe distance, won't be so easy and we are not allowed to sing. And this is the reading I have before me today from Ecclesiastes 5: 1-2. "Be careful about going to the House of God. Think before you speak, and don't make any rash promises to God. He is in heaven and you are on earth, so don't say more than you have to."

As I read on to verse 7 I find these words: "No matter how much you dream or how much you talk, remain still and in awe of God." Wherever and whenever you choose to worship God, we are joined together by His Spirit, and we worship as one. May you feel the strength of His peace and love for you. Stay safe.

Returning to Church

We will re-open for Worship on Sunday 20th September. This will be to see/listen to the telephone service, but with video, initially. Information about the new ways of working is attached in a separate document. You can, of course, continue to listen to the dial-in service from the comfort of your own home.

We have created 2 "zones" in the building – one with the hall, ladies toilets and kitchen that the external users will use and one with the Welcome Space, Sanctuary, Vestry and Gents/disabled toilets that the church will use. This allows us to manage the risk more effectively.

Although the building will be open, it is important that we know who is going in. Please don't come and go as you have in the past – only attend when someone will take responsibility for following the guidelines and keeping a record of attendees. If you need to "pop in" for

something, please let one of the Church Stewards know – Amy Driver, Viv Briney, Dave Briney, David Ogilvy or Elizabeth Soehren.
