

Message from Rev Katharine Bland

Dear Friends,

I'm so glad the circuit is celebrating Harvest this Sunday - the 'All We Can' appeal invites us all to reflect on the strapline that 'Change begins with us!' We are encouraged to donate to their campaign for this year which is 'Change Begins With A Bicycle'. In addition, Atherton Central, currently the only church in the circuit who are open for worship, have been receiving harvest gifts which will be donated to a foodbank. All ways that we can help bring about a change for good to the lives of people who are struggling to get through these trying times. Another change is upon us too.....the Autumn season is now well and truly with us. The leaves are falling, the earth is ploughed up and the branches are thinning out - there are spaces. In many ways the trees are taking on a look of 'social distancing' too! It's important to remember that nature isn't dying, nature is resting, creating space, slowing down and preparing herself.
