Message from Rev Katharine Bland

Dear Friends,

I can't believe that this is my last newsletter before Christmas! And what a different kind of Christmas we will all experience this year. Like many families, we won't all be meeting together this year, preferring to heed the advice of keeping contact to a minimum, and staying in touch with family members by phone and zoom rather than in person. We shall look forward to, hopefully, celebrating together at Easter.

For those of you who have been reflecting with me each Sunday by drawing a candle, I have included a candle reflection for Christmas Day. I was asked in the week "what shall we do with the candles we have drawn?" As we will wait until 25th to draw our 5th candle it means we won't be able to share them before Christmas. But I still think it would be a lovely idea to be able to see each other's candles. I think I may display mine in my study window.

Sunday 20th Dec - 4th Sunday in Advent.

Let's draw a candle of love - remember to draw a flame; it will signify the love of God that surrounds and fills us at all times; a flame that we recognize in a special way in the Christmas story. There is no greater power than love. It is stronger than rulers and empires, stronger than grief or despair, stronger even than death. We love, because God loves us.

Loving God, I open myself to you this Christmas season. May the candles I have drawn light my life with your imagination. Show me the creative power of hope. Teach me the peace that comes from justice. Fill me with the kind of joy that cannot be contained, but must be shared. Magnify your love within me. Support Needed

Although we are not currently meeting in person, the work of our team continues – the Pastoral team have, of course, been particularly busy since March, and so many people have been praying. Behind the scenes, volunteers continue to manage our finances, lettings and property, and the Steward team are currently planning some extra activities we can all get involved in during the Advent and Christmas season.

Could you offer any support? As you will have seen in our last Church Council minutes, our finances are in good shape at the moment, so it would be a great time to take on the **Treasurer** role, with able support from Julie Mainwaring as bookkeeper and Julie Worswick on Gift Aid. Perhaps you'd like to join the **Steward or Pastoral team**? As most of you know, Viv & Dave Briney are planning to move as soon as they are able, which will leave some big gaps, but ones we can fill in different ways.

Remember, you don't need to do these roles in the same way as the previous person did – all the roles can be shaped to fit your gifts, and perhaps you will bring a different way of working that will help us renew!

A note on Covid-19 vaccines from Eion MacDonald.

I note the hope about the vaccine. It is not an instant protection from others or instant protection to others. I think it important to advise all that none of the vaccines presently developed stop you from spreading the disease. This is most important. No trials have been done on this.

We must take all care to continue to isolate after receiving the vaccine by using a mask, spacing, hand washing etc. to avoid any spread to you while you develop anti-bodies. And thereafter to protect others.

The vaccine will take upwards of 31 days to give you basic protection. This period is the cumulative time from first vaccine injection; then a period of 21 days to second vaccine injection; then a minimum of 10 days after second injection before your own antibodies are developed and working. If second vaccination is delayed the time period is still 10 days after second vaccination.

Thus you are not protected from serious risk until say at least five weeks after the first injection or two weeks after the second injection. Prior to this you are still at considerable risk but declining from after the second injection.

At all times after vaccination, you (the vaccinated) can still spread the disease, there is no experimental studies available yet on this response, to any of the vaccines. Thus mask wearing to protect others must still continue.

As no trials have been done on under 18 year olds, they will not receive the vaccination and that large portion of the population are still spreaders, as are cats and some other animals. (refer Denmark experience.)
