

Message from Amy Driver

Rev Katharine is taking some more time to recover from her illness.

What a joy it has been this last few weeks to start to meet people face-to-face for garden chats. All the telephone calls and zoom connections are wonderful, but not as good as a real life conversation in 3 dimensions. And we have been so blessed with beautiful weather to be able to enjoy them without needing to wrap up too much - I'm reminded of one 4 person gathering last year, when we sat on garden chairs under a large umbrella each, carrying on despite the downpour, we just had to choose whether to have a wet back or wet knees!

It has been very exciting this week to see the progress of the garden at the front of church, have you walked past? The pre-school children were most excited by the digger! The flags are going down today, and the seating is ready and waiting for the work to be finished so it can be installed and become a place for us to connect with each other. Thank you so much to everyone who has worked to bring this project to fruition.

Connection is so important – one of our core human needs. I don't know about you, but for me there is a mixture of emotions – relief at being able to connect in person again, and a trepidation about staying safe, wondering whether this really is the light at the end of the tunnel, or whether there might be more yet to come. I give thanks that I was able to have my vaccine last week, but also feel sorrow that it came too late for so many, and that so many people, including Rev Katharine and Paul, continue to suffer from the long term health impact of the virus.

Some of the slowing down that has been forced upon us has been a respite from constant busyness. In my house, my work has continued, but I rarely commute there, we have had much less juggling of evening activities and meal times, and there is space in our weekends for rest and replenishment. Can we emerge from our homes but retain some of those things? My hope is that I remember to value the things I once took for granted, and that I take care about what I "pick up" again. In the Lent reflections from LICC I followed this year, the last day reminded us that Paul was imprisoned, and had his travelling ministry curtailed. He switched to writing letters to encourage the fledgling churches, and witnessed to the palace guard. He was "pruned", that he could be even more fruitful – to think that those letters are still be being read 2000 years later!

Making Our Church A Safe And Welcoming Place

You will have read just how much domestic violence is increasing especially during lockdown. I recently attended a training session designed to make us realise how churches need to step up to the plate to recognise domestic abuse and how best to support those suffering or who have suffered such pain. Sadly we also learned how churches often make things worse for the people and families involved.

This coincided with running a safeguarding training module and refreshing my own mind on the myriad ways in which people are abused including modern slavery, neglect, cruelty, financial, spiritual, bullying, sexual and so many others. The people involved in the training session were determined that CMC should become a model of good practice in safeguarding so we would be a safe place and a beacon of hope to everyone suffering any kind of abuse in our community. The stewards and Council will be discussing what we as a church family need to do to achieve this vision

In the meantime as individuals could we all commit to raising our own personal awareness of the issues of safeguarding? Are we confident that we would recognise worrying signs? And would we know what to do if we did?

To help us keep focused on this I plan a short monthly Safeguarding paragraph for the notice-sheet...perhaps about something in the news or something happening in church policy or about an aspect of safeguarding.....The positives as well the worries. Let's try it and see whether it is useful, if not I'll stop.

Joining the Sunday Service via the internet

Would you like to join our Sunday Service on your computer, so you can see the preacher (and each other) as well as hear them? We are now offering this option. If you prefer the telephone, you can continue as before - there are no changes.

If you would like to join, click on this link (which will be the same every week) and follow the instructions below:

Click on the link to join the "Webex" system and join in that way. Webex is like "Zoom" and other virtual meeting systems.

You will be on "mute" and won't be able to be heard. Only the people taking part in the service will be able to unmute themselves. You can decide whether you wish to be seen - click "Start my video" at the bottom of the screen if you are happy to be on view, or "Stop Video" if not. I would encourage you to have it on if possible, it's lovely for us to be able to see each other. On a laptop, once you click the link, you can download the app (recommended) or click "join from your browser", which takes you in through your internet.

If you are using a tablet or smartphone, it will prompt you to download the Webex app. You will need to enter your name and an email address, then click "Join Meeting". If you use the app, at the top right-hand corner of the screen, there is a control called "layout" - set this to "Stage" or "Focus" so that the person speaking will appear larger on your screen. On the internet browser, this is automatic.

If you need to put in the meeting number, this is the number from the phone-in - 145 404 825 **Troubleshooting:** If you can't hear, either click on "connect to audio" at the bottom of the screen, or click on the down arrow next to "Unmute" and choose the headphones/speakers that you are using. Also, check the volume on your computer/device is turned up, and not muted. If all else fails, it might be worth leaving by clicking the red "X" and then rejoining from the link. I hope this works for you, improves your experience of our Sunday services and helps you feel more connected. Love, Amy.
