Church Arranged Transport

It is really appreciated that Culcheth drivers are thoughtful in offering lifts when needed. As there will be more shared events we wondered whether it might be good to have an official scheme for arranging lifts to ensure no one missed out because they couldn't arrange a lift themselves. A few weeks ago, therefore, I wrote to everyone about the possible introduction of church organised arrangements. However, these would have to comply with safeguarding regulations.

A few drivers have come forward who have offered to be involved in a formal scheme but the majority prefer to continue to offer lifts on a "friend to friend" basis. We have concluded, therefore, that it isn't feasible to try to establish a scheme. I am sorry to say that this means that the church cannot act, even informally, as a "matchmaker" for drivers and those needing a lift. This is because if we did, in the event of a problem arising, it could be argued that the church was following an official scheme which should have checked and trained drivers. Thus, there will not be any more announcements offering to arrange lifts.

Hopefully everyone who needs a lift will continue to be able to find one but just in case we will put a list in the foyer for each shared event where people can add their name if they need a lift. Hopefully drivers who intend to go to that event will keep their eye on it and help out if they have any spare seats.

During these conversations about an official scheme some drivers have asked questions about their insurance when giving a "friend to friend lift". Problems are not envisaged but drivers might like to check their own policies.

As we are not getting any sprightlier I plan, also, to put together some practical tips for drivers who assist the less mobile amongst us.

Meet Janet: a grandmother who transformed her dusty land into a garden of hope.



A women who has faced the worst of the climate crisis is Janet, a grandmother from Zimbabwe. In her village, Janet has experienced first hand how drought pushed her family into desperate hunger.

'One year, there was so little food. Rains had not fallen. We ate things which we wouldn't eat in normal times. I made porridge and gave it to the children, then removed a portion and put it

down for the dogs. The children picked up the dogs' share because they weren't full. When I saw this, I knew the situation had become unbearable,' Janet shared.'My heart was so painful thinking that my family would die. By God's grace we did not die. We soldiered on.'

With faith, hope and love for her family, Janet brought her family through this painful time with the support of Christian Aid's BRACT programme (Building Resilience through Absorptive and Adaptive Capacities for Transformation).

BRACT helps the most at-risk communities in Zimbabwe to prepare for and adapt to the changing climate. Working with local partners, Christian Aid's work empowers vulnerable communities to grow drought-tolerant crop, teaches women like Janet how to grow food in dry seasons and helps families to build storerooms to preserve food so they have the resilience to bounce back from future droughts. Families learn to eat more healthy, nutritious food and gain new skills for alternative sources of income when agriculture fails.

By learning how to grow drought-resistant crops with the support of Christian Aid, Janet was able to bring her family through a painful time and turn her barren land into a garden of plenty. Now, her farm is bursting with life, and she harvests enough surplus food to share with her neighbours while also storing enough to survive future droughts.

You can help women like Jessica and Janet turn hunger into hope. So far, Christian Aid has helped over 27,000 people in Zimbabwe to stand strong and resilient to the climate crisis. But there is still more to do.

Current Covid Precautions

Following the changes to the Covid regulations, the church council have agreed some small changes to our Covid precautions at church. We now:

- Wear masks in Church services. Smaller groups meeting within the Church building can make their own decisions as to whether to wear masks following discussions within the members. It is hoped that groups will be sensitive towards those who prefer masks still to be worn.
- Maintain Social Distancing from others not in our household.
- Use hand sanitiser as we arrive and leave the building.
- Take a lateral flow test before we come if possible.
- Please do not attend if you are suffering from any symptoms or have been in close contact with someone with Covid.
- Wipe down common surfaces after use (door handles, light switches, chair arms etc)
- Rather than having the main entrance doors open for ventilation the windows in the Welcome Space will be opened during services. The fire door in the Sanctuary will still be partially open.
- If you prefer not to have anybody besides you please indicate by placing something on the next chair please don't move around but remain seated.
- Retiring collection rather than passing round the bags.
- Chairs have been returned to rows with a space of 1.3m between rows (from the back of one chair to the back of the one in front). It is recommended that you leave 2 empty chairs between household groups. If you wish to sit closer, please make sure that both parties agree!
- Tea and Coffee we are now able to serve drinks and individually wrapped snacks.
