Gift Day

Sunday July 10th will be a Gift Day at church.

Carol Sherratt has made a great start as our treasurer and is fast getting to grips with it all. I don't think it will come as a surprise to you that we are not in a secure financial position. The "golden rule" is that our giving should at least cover the quarterly assessment, which pays for our ministers, manses etc. This is £3567 per month. Our current giving (including gift aid) stands at £3277 per month, leaving a monthly deficit of £290 per month. In addition, we have our running costs - which are currently £4000 more per year than our income from lettings.

We have identified July 10th as an ideal opportunity to hold a gift day, when Carol will provide further details of our financial position, but please give the matter some thought, and if you can increase your giving, do feel free to do so as soon as you are able! Speak to Carol or Julie if you need any information.

Joint Services

You'll be aware from earlier pieces in the Notices that there are going to be more joint services in the Circuit, some of which will involve travelling to other churches. I know this is not a welcome development for some people but would encourage you to consider the positive aspects:

- * Access to a "live" rather than a streamed service
- * Sharing of resources enables a better quality of worship
- * Sharing venues, ideas and fellowship makes us a wider and more inclusive family

Please also see Linda's notice about arranging lifts. I hope that drivers who are able to give lifts will check the notice board to see who needs transport.

There have been 2 successful and well-attended joint services with Glazebury on the 22nd and 29th May. I hope you can agree with me that worshipping in a well-filled church amongst friends from other congregations lifts the spirits and enriches the experience.

Looking at the new Plan for June to August, there is a planned Joint Service with Glazebury led by Alan Eaves here at Culcheth on the 3rd July. In addition, both Culcheth and Glazebury have Own Arrangement services planned on the 31st July and 28th August which seem ideal opportunities for joint worship. There are also two Sundays when a preacher is planned at Glazebury and we have an Own Arrangement:

19th June - Terry Wynn is leading worship at Glazebury 17th July - Rev Katharine with Holy Communion at Glazebury

I would very much like to hear how people feel about going to Glazebury to worship on these two Sundays.

Church Arranged Transport

It is really appreciated that Culcheth drivers are thoughtful in offering lifts when needed. As there will be more shared events we wondered whether it might be good to have an official scheme for arranging lifts to ensure no one missed out because they couldn't arrange a lift themselves. A few weeks ago, therefore, I wrote to everyone about the possible introduction of church organised arrangements. However, these would have to comply with safeguarding regulations.

A few drivers have come forward who have offered to be involved in a formal scheme but the majority prefer to continue to offer lifts on a "friend to friend" basis. We have concluded, therefore, that it isn't feasible to try to establish a scheme. I am sorry to say that this means that the church cannot act, even informally, as a "matchmaker" for drivers and those needing a lift. This is because if we did, in the event of a problem arising, it could be argued that the church was following an official scheme which should have checked and trained drivers. Thus, there will not be any more announcements offering to arrange lifts. Hopefully everyone who needs a lift will continue to be able to find one but just in case we will put a list in the foyer for each shared event where people can add their name if they

need a lift. Hopefully drivers who intend to go to that event will keep their eye on it and help out if they have any spare seats.

During these conversations about an official scheme some drivers have asked questions about their insurance when giving a "friend to friend lift". Problems are not envisaged but drivers might like to check their own policies.

Thank you to everyone for participating in this discussion and all the information and advice that was shared.
