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### **Church Finances July 2022**

I knew when I took on the role of Church Treasurer, it wasn't going to be easy but I know that I can do the mathematics and trust in God. I will not be responsible solely for decision making for that is up to the Church Council and church members.

Back in December 2019 a letter went out to explain just how the church's finances were then, not in a great shape. Well as you can imagine due to people moving away, passing away and personal circumstances changing, regular giving no longer covers the Circuit Assessment which has to be paid first and foremost. This funds our ministers and manses primarily. At a Circuit Treasurers' meeting we shared each church's state of finances. Most of the 11 churches had experienced the same problems; having to use dwindling reserves. Even the circuit itself has had to produce a balanced budget for next year.

Our assessment is the same as the current year, £42,807.20 but in order to meet all our bills, our income has to increase. The cost of living is rising for everyone including the church. Our gas fixed rate contract ends early next year and whilst we will endeavour to find a good new contract the cost will undoubtedly rise. This is just one example.

The total funds at the start of the year were  $\pounds$ 52,513 of which  $\pounds$ 29,707 were restricted, ring-fenced or earmarked for certain projects. These funds cannot be used for general purposes. During the 9 months to the end of May, Income has exceeded expenditure by  $\pounds$ 4,571.

At present we have £27,378 with which to pay the monthly bills and hopefully we will have approximately £13k income in June, July and August (If the summer term lettings invoices are paid before the end of August). Expenditure will be £18k. The next instalment of the assessment, £10,702 is due early August and this must be paid. As Methodists we have to cover this commitment but our giving at present does not match this. On top of this our building needs essential maintenance and tasks completing before the next Quinquennial Report. We should also have 6 months of expenditure in reserves but this has dwindled to very little.

We have God and faith on our side and if it is His will, we will be able to meet these costs BUT it needs everyone to think seriously about their giving of both gifts and talents. Gifts include praying, increasing a Standing Order or giving a one-off donation. Don't forget to let us know if your donation can be Gift Aided.

It would be good for church members and the community to have a few fundraising events. We all like to have an event where there is food, chatter, laughter and maybe even a quiz and after the various lockdowns and restrictions over the last two years I think that we are ready to start socialising a bit more, albeit with caution. Could you lead or form part of a team organising a fundraising day, morning, afternoon or evening? The more that volunteer, the less work for each person. The possibilities are endless but we do need

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bodies. A simple soup and roll lunch on a Saturday might be an example. Calling all those who bake bread and make soup if such an event appeals.

The church really does need more funds on a regular basis to keep our presence in Culcheth alive with the Good News and continue to support the community. If you can volunteer your expertise or want to Gift Aid a donation please let one of the stewards know.
