Message from Rev Katharine

Dear Friends,

The 30th June 2021 will go down in history as a momentous day for the Methodist Church in Britain, because it is the day when the Methodist Conference voted overwhelmingly in favour of accepting the proposals of the 'God in love unites us' (GILUU) report, concerning the church's understanding of marriage and relationships. Amongst the proposals was one whereby Methodist Churches can, with the approval of the Church Council, seek to change their marriage registration to enable them to host weddings for same-sex couples.

At the recent Church Council meetings for Culcheth and Glazebury Methodist Churches, the decisions were made to take this vote at the next Church Council. The outcome of the vote by church trustees will decide on the registration status for the church building.

It is important to note that The Methodist Church recognises that there are different ways of interpreting scripture, and also very different views on same-sex relationships and has sought to enable people within the church to live with 'contradictory convictions'. No member of the church, lay or ordained, will be required to participate in a ceremony that goes against the dictates of their conscience, and it may be that some churches in the Leigh & Hindley Circuit will not vote to conduct same-sex weddings.

To quote our new President of Conference, The Rev'd Sonia Hicks:

"We very much appreciate that these decisions will stir up many different emotions across they Connexion. There will be some who will be deeply hurt and others who will rejoice by what has been decided."

"It is perhaps helpful to remember that there are other issues, some of them discussed at the Conference, on which we hold differing and sometimes strong opinions. We live with them and we do not allow them to impair our communion with each other. We respect each other's consciences, we exercise judgment in when to speak and when to be silent, and we hold one another in prayer. We do all this not for our own sake but for the sake of Christ and the sake of the world which urgently needs to know the power of Christ's reconciling love.

Our prayer to you, beloved siblings, is that in joy or sorrow, in pain or excitement, we might continue to live within that reconciling love."

The 'God In Love Unites Us' report is available to read in full, and I am always here for you if you wish to have conversation or prayer, or both!
