Message from Rev Katharine

Dear Friends,

One of the first things I like to share with my church families is 'my story'. I don't like the word 'testimony', it's far too churchy a word! But I do like the word story, and we all have a story to share. From my school-life to my working-life, I seem to have chosen paths that involve wearing a variety of uniforms! I'll hang back sharing my story with you in this newsletter, I would much prefer to share it with you all in person, and hopefully that opportunity will be very soon. So, for now, I'll just reveal to you that I left school at 16yrs and I joined the Army!

Did you know that Saturday 27th June is Armed Forces Day? It's a day when we are encouraged to remember, give thanks, and hold in our prayers our armed forces personnel. Here is a little snippet from the 'Armed Forces Christian Union' website: Life in the Forces – Service personnel spend a large proportion of their military service in training. After basic recruit training (Phase 1) and trade training (Phase 2) individual training takes place throughout their careers. Once established in their ships or units much time is spent on collective training to prepare for possible operations, for peacekeeping, for disaster relief at home or abroad, and for assisting the government, as has been the case with the Covid pandemic. Whilst exercises can be exciting and give a degree of realism, they can also be dangerous, frequent, and involve long spells away from home.

- best and grasp the knowledge and skills that they need to do their job well.
- Pray for safety of those undertaking exercises and for their families while they
- are away from home.
- Pray for those planning exercises, that they will have an eye for detail so that
- the exercises achieve their purpose.
- Pray for military Christians on deployment that they will show integrity and be
- a witness to their colleagues while they are together for long periods of time.

From the Field Service Book of the British Army Almighty God, in you alone we find safety and peace.

We commend to your gracious keeping

all the men and women who serve in the Navy, the Army or the Air Force, who face danger and put their lives at risk so that others might live in safety. Defend them day by day by your heavenly power;

and help them to know that they can never pass beyond the reach of your care. Keep alive in them and in us your vision of that peace

Communion Changes

In order to improve the Communion service, but in a Covid safe way, we will be trying something new. The congregation will remain seated, Rev Katharine will move around dropping the bread into your hand (no physical contact). The Steward will then follow with the tray of wine – each glass will be set out with a gap around it, so you will take the glass without touching others. Hands will be sanitised, and masks will be worn throughout, and during the setting out of the elements in advance. Used glasses will be placed under your seat for collection later. If you would prefer not to do this, please speak to a steward when you arrive.
