'Posada' - Churches Together Advent 2025

Churches Together will be doing something different and rather special this year to mark the season of Advent. Posada (Spanish for 'inn') is a lovely tradition, originating in Mexico, in which Mary and Joseph are symbolically welcomed into peoples lives for a night.

Mary and Joseph, in the form of Russian dolls, will be hosted by a household for one night and then passed to another family or gathering of people. They will be accompanied by a folder which explains the tradition, and contains prayers which can be used, pictures to colour in, and space for people to write down what they do and what it means to them.

Our two churches will host Mary and Joseph during the week beginning Sunday 14th December. Hosts are already signed up, including Gilbert Court and Holcroft Grange, where Mary and Joseph will be part of our Christmas service on 18th December. I will make sure Mary and Joseph are delivered and collected as arranged.

A good number of us gathered at Newchurch Rectory the afternoon of the first Sunday in Advent to mark the start of Mary and Joseph's journey around the churches when we sang carols accompanied by the handbell ringers and fortified ourselves against the cold with mulled wine and mince pies. Don't forget we'll do the same at 4.00pm on Christmas Eve when Mary and Joseph reach journey's end.
