

Culcheth Open Gardens will be on **Saturday and Sunday 5th and 6th July**. The gardens will be open from 1.30-5.00pm each day, refreshments available till 4.00pm at 22 Chiltern Road. #### **Summary of Invitation and Stationing Process (September 2026)**

Rev Wilfred Robinson's 5-year term as Superintendent of the Leigh and Hindley circuit will complete at the end of August 2026 and Rev Wilfred has indicated that he would like to consider an extension. The Circuit can invite an extension for up to five years, or not, and the Circuit Invitation Committee will make its recommendation in August on re-invitation based on a consultation, to be confirmed at the Circuit Meeting in September.

As this appointment affects the Superintendent, all the churches are involved in the consultation, and ours will take place this **Sunday 22nd June** after our hub service at Glazebury, lead by Susan Fisher and Thomas Martin. Amy and Delia will co-ordinate these conversations, which must take place verbally, either face to face at this time, or over the phone. This is about gathering views, not votes, and all discussions will remain confidential and not be attributable.
